- Kansas Attorney General. The Kansas AFL-CIO has endorsed Steve Six
- United State Congress. The Kansas AFL-CIO has endorsed Raj Goyle.
- United States Senate. The Kansas AFL-CIO has endorsed Lisa Johnston

IMPORTANT DATES TO REMEMBER:

Deadline to register to vote or change parties was October 18th. Advance voting in Kansas began on October 13, 2010. The deadline to apply for advance voting is October 29, 2010. This means that up until October 29, 2010, Kansas voters can apply to vote prior to Election Day (November 2). With advance voting, you never have to leave your home, take time off work or stand in line. Just be sure to follow the instructions (sign the envelope!) and get it in before the deadline.
